The Brakenhale School uses a biometric system for library authentication and for students to purchase refreshments in the school dining room.						
The biometric identification system operated at The Brakenhale School uses the finger and its image to uniquely identify each student and member of staff. The system measures many aspects of a finger and then translates the measurements into a unique identification code which is entered into the system. The image of the fingerprint itself is not recorded or stored. This is not fingerprinting and the data stored cannot be used to recreate an image of the fingerprint. When a student uses the biometric identification systems, they are identified by their identification code. This form of identification is called biometrics, which translated means measurements of human characteristics. The Brakenhale School will comply at all times with Data Protection Act and with the provisions of the Protection of Freedoms Act regarding the use of biometric data. We can offer an option to opt out of the biometric system, but this requires the dining room staff to manually look up a student's name at the till, which is a slower and less secure system.
