



The most common occupation is 'Professional' (28%), followed by 'Associate Professional and Tech' then 'Managers, Directors and Senior Officials'

#### **Key facts**

Berkshire has the highest proportion of Foreign Owned Companies in the UK and these companies employ nearly a third of the private sector workforce here.

However, the majority of workplaces in Berkshire are microsize (1-9 employees).


#### **Leading Berkshire Employers**



18% of all jobs in Berkshire are classified as STEAM jobs, nearly twice the proportional national average.

The largest proportion by far are in Digital Tech which account for 57% or all STEAM related jobs.





Approaching two thirds (63%) of all jobs in Berkshire require mid-level qualifications while 32% of jobs within the area require a degree.

From the graph, we can see that for Berkshire, at every level of qualification, there is a higher percentage of those who hold the qualification than there is a percentage of jobs which require it.



The projected occupational change in Berkshire depicts a decline in the labour-intensive occupations between 2019 and 2027 which will be further absorbed by the high-skill, middle-skill and service intensive occupations.

# Diversity and Inclusion in the Workplace in Berkshire

- 16% of the workforce in Berkshire were non-UK nationals in 2019, up from 12.4% in 2009 (compared to 11.4% nationally in 2019 and 7.7% nationally in 2009)
- 13% of Berkshire's workforce were aged 16-24 in 2021
- The gender pay gap between male and female employees working in or resident in Berkshire is one of the largest in the country suggesting a gap in the nature of work for males and females
- In Berkshire, 75.9% of women aged 16-64 are employed in the workforce compared to 81.4% of men.

55% of Berkshire's workforce are in managerial, professional or associate professional occupations (compared to 47% nationally)

Almost double the national average work as Science, Research, Engineering and Technology Professionals

Approaching 1 in 5 organisations are recording skill deficiencies.

1 in 3 job vacancies are hard to fill.

There are concerns regarding supply and demand for skills at Level 3 and gaps in Apprenticeship provision in certain job families/industries.

#### **Current Challenges in the Job Market**

- 17% of organisations record skills deficiencies
- 33% of 5600 job vacancies are hard to fill (EMSI)
- Potential mismatch between the supply of and demand for skills at Level 3 within the engineering, construction and digital technologies job families
- Potential gaps in Apprenticeship provision in business administration subjects; engineering; health; education, construction and creative industries









#### **Key facts**

Management skills of various descriptions are highly sought after in the current labour market. This is also the case for STEAM skills.

Companies of various different types working with STEAM sectors are greatly in need of workers in the future.



27% of Berkshire employers who recruit school leavers believe they are poorly prepared for work.

Of these, 12% say they believe young people have a poor attitude / lack motivation. So whilst most don't think this, a fair chunk do.

By far the main essential skill that employers in Berkshire (and in the rest of the country) are looking for is good communication.

#### **Key facts**

The world of work is changing. As we enter the Fourth Industrial Revolution, developments in fields such as robotics, AI, nanotechnol ogy and autonomous vehicles, look set to change the way we live and work.

Across all sectors of the economy, different skills will be needed. Some roles will disappear and many more will evolve.

# Looking to the future, according to the World Economic Forum, the 10 skills you need to have a successful career in 2025 are:

- Analytical thinking and innovation
- Active learning and learning strategies
- Complex problem solving
- Critical thinking and analysis
- · Creativity, originality and initiative
- Leadership and social influence

- Technology use, monitoring and control
- Technology design and programming
- Resilience, stress tolerance and flexibility
- Reasoning, problem solving and ideation









#### **Key Facts**

The employment impacts of COVID-19 have been greater for young people and a higher than average proportion of young people in Berkshire (7.5%) will enter the labour market in the next 5 years.

Economic recovery in the region is dependent upon a number of factors, including the recovering of neighbouring areas such as London and Heathrow Airport. However, initial signs have been more positive than in many other areas of the country.

## The Effects of COVID-19 on Employment in Berkshire

- A lower than average percentage of employees were affected by the COVID-19 lockdown in Berkshire than nationally 15.5% vs 16.9%
- The employment impacts of COVID-19 have been greater for young people and job entry for them could be significantly affected by future recruitment freezes. A higher than average proportion of young people in Berkshire (7.5%) will enter the labour market in the next 5 years.
- Training and upskilling activities which the LEP is involved in will help ensure that Berkshire is resilient in the face of challenges such as an ageing population or the increasing automaton of job roles.
- Economic recovery in Berkshire will be influenced by our neighbours including London & Heathrow airport due to the number of commuters to these areas.









#### **Key Facts**

Berkshire is well placed for recovery.

Young people will be disproportionally affected by the impacts of COVID-19.

Berkshire includes many businesses in traditionally more resilient sectors such as science based industries and business and professional services.

## The Effects of COVID-19 on Employment in Berkshire

- The full extent of the impact of COVID-19 on the economy in Berkshire is not yet known but there will be longer-term implications on the availability of entry level and lower skilled jobs
- Young people, women and lower skilled workers will be disproportionately affected by the impacts of COVID-19
- Berkshire has a track record of employment in more resilient sectors such as science-based industries and business & professional services.
- We are already seeing the positive impact of our immediate recovery and renewal activity through, for example, the Berkshire Opportunities skills and employment portal.












From the graph it is clear that Apprentice
Technician and Engineers are the most in demand with 43 and 37 job postings respectively across 2021.

These top ten apprenticeship titles are all within the engineering and IT sectors.

#### **Top advertised Apprenticeships**


