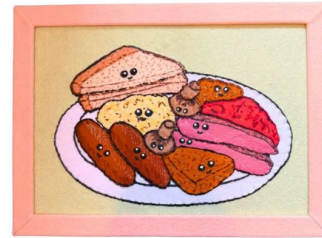


What is she famous for? Lucy Sparrow is a British contemporary artist known for creating fun, colorful, and life-sized versions of everyday objects—**entirely out of felt!** Instead of painting or sculpting, she stitches and stuffs fabric to recreate items you'd normally find in a shop, like cans of soup, chocolate bars, and even entire supermarket shelves.

What is her most famous work? Her most famous projects include **"The Cornershop" (2014)**, where she turned a whole London shop into a felt convenience store, and **"8 Till Late" (2017)**, a fully stocked felt supermarket in New York. She has also made soft versions of pharmacies, fast food outlets, and even an art gallery.

What is her work about? Sparrow's work makes people think about everyday shopping, mass production, and how we connect with the objects around us. By turning ordinary products into handmade art, she brings a sense of nostalgia and fun, encouraging people to look at familiar things in a new way.

**Blanket stitch:** a stitch used to reinforce the edge of fabric.

It is a **decorative stitch** used to stitch shapes of fabric to a background to create applique' pictures.

- it decorates
- it stitches the layers together
- it stops the edges from fraying
