



Dear Parents/Carers

This week has seen the start of an intensive period of revision and focus for our Year 11 students. Monday to Thursday they were timetabled into each of their option subjects for a full day to continue their mastery in these areas. Year 11 teachers all reported a great learning attitude from the students and some impressive progress being made, well done Year 11! The year group now have next week back into normal lessons then two weeks of their pre-public examinations. Thank you to all the parents and carers for the support that you are giving to the students at this time.

Year 9 have been busily revising this week for their examinations Monday to Wednesday next week. Mr Gibson led an assembly with the students on effective revision on Wednesday and Mr Thomas has spoken to them this morning about examination procedures. We know that this is very new to our Year 9 students but we are pleased that they are taking the preparation for these examinations seriously, again thank you to parents and carers for their support.

Year 10 had a very successful parents evening last night, with a 90% turnout. A huge thank you to all the staff who contributed to this and of course to you as parents for meeting with us and caring so much about your child's future and potential.

It may only be four weeks until we break up for Christmas, however, at no point will we be relaxing our focus on high expectations and challenge. We have introduced a new development cycle for staff which involves very regular drop-ins to lessons to ensure that individual teachers receive constant guidance on the very best practice nationally. These have started incredibly well and it has been so positive for myself and the senior team to spend so much time in lessons focusing on what really matters, the learning. This will continue across the rest of the academic year. I am proud to lead a staff who strive to be the very best in what they do.

This week we have said goodbye to two members of staff, Mr Long and Miss Harris, who have left for individual personal reasons. Mrs Higham and Miss Cresswell, as Heads of these departments, will be reallocating teaching periods across their staff to ensure that for the remainder of this term students continue to receive specialist teaching. In January we are extremely fortunate to have joining us two very high calibre colleagues, one of whom, Mrs Low, is already employed within the trust at Greenshaw High School. Her product design results at A level were the best in the country last year! Miss Dawson will be joining the English department as she relocates to this area, she is a very impressive English teacher with an excellent track record. It is because of our reputation as a school that is constantly achieving great things and is a place with high expectations and a warm atmosphere that we continue to attract such strong staff.

This week is the first week of a new student recognition award. I am very aware that so many of our young people go above and beyond on a regular basis to support not only their own learning but that of others and the school as a whole. 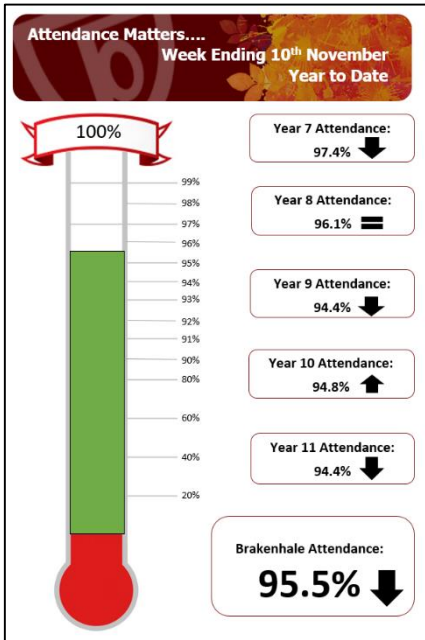

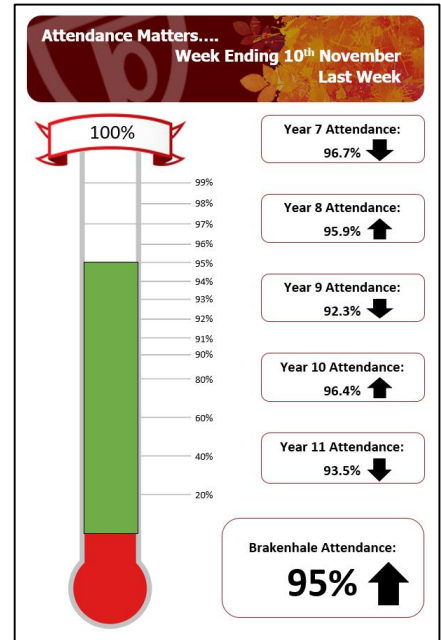
Attendance

Last week saw us hit our weekly 95% target! Year 7 lead the way with 96.7% closely followed by Year 10 with 96.4%. This is a fantastic result for Year 10 especially, as they had been really struggling with attendance this year. We have completed our conversations with our students that are persistently absent - those students with attendance below 90% - and they have been set individual targets to achieve by the end of this term. We currently have 407 students with 100% attendance this year so far compared to 273 at the same point last year, this brilliant result is a reflection of just how much everyone is focusing on attendance!
