Transition Days @ Brakenhale

This year has seen an even busier time for Transition, not only did 217 Year 6 students join us for 2 fantastic days in preparation for September but we also welcomed 170 Year 5 students as they completed a 'WOW Day @ Brakenhale' - more details below!

It is so important for younger students to experience secondary school life, allowing them to feel safe and confident as they and their families begin to consider secondary school options. On Friday 28 June, we welcomed with open arms - 170 Year 5 students and their teachers joined us at Brakenhale - WOW what a fantastic day! We welcomed students from Foxhill, Wildridings and Crownwood and for the whole day they experienced secondary school lessons, break, lunch and of course the sheer size of a secondary school! All students participated with great enthusiasm in Science, Technology and Performing Arts (Drama, Dance, Music) lessons; they were smiling on arrival, smiling throughout the day and were smiling even wider as they left. They were extremely polite and grateful - some students left with rock cakes (several had to eat them on the day!), many with cork inspired super-hero figures but they all left having experienced colour changing chemicals in Science; to finish the day they participated in a Cadet Force Parade and drills, they truly 'attacked' this session. 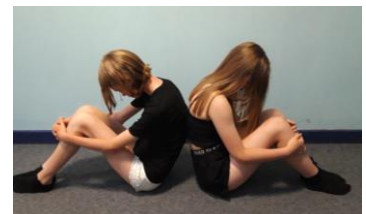



I want to alert you to an event that we are planning for next term. We are going to hold a second hand clothes sale, selling several categories of clothing, including:

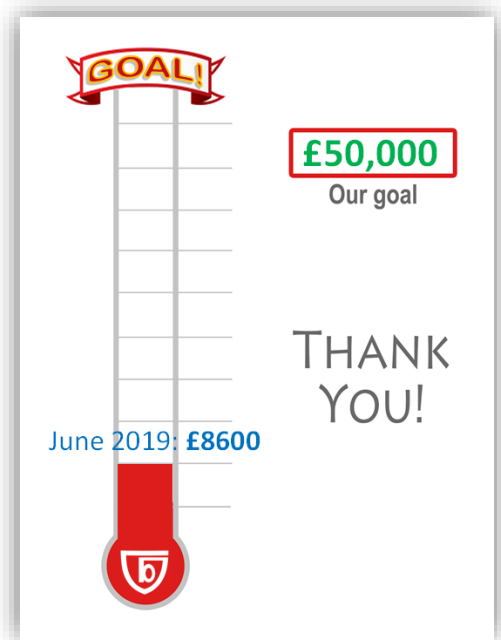
- Jumble


