



Dear Parents/Carers

As the cold descends upon us and the Christmas bells are faintly heard in the background life on the ground at Brakenhale continues at a pace. This week has seen our first Post 16 parents' evening for Year 13 students and a staggering 96% turnout. This is such an amazing reflection of the strong and supportive relationships that you as parents have with the school and individual staff. Year 10 parents' evening is coming up next week and we are hoping for a similar turn out. Next week also sees our Year 11 into Sixth Form day where Year 11 students have a day of taster lessons in the Sixth Form, trying out the subjects which they have expressed an interest in. Staff are busily planning lessons which will give a real insight into what the courses are like, to give students a real understanding of the choices on offer.

A group of Year 10 Maths students were at Wellington College for a day this week for a Maths extension day. This was a fantastic opportunity for our very talented Year 10 Maths students to receive further tuition in the subject with some top teachers in the field. The students had a great day and we are continuing to strengthen relations with a variety of providers to ensure all students get the opportunity to expand and enhance their academic knowledge. Today a group of Year 10 students are out with Mrs Lowe and Mr Esling on a visit to the Design Museum in London and I have no doubt they will be inspired.

A big thanks to all of you who are continuing to sell the Rotary Club raffle tickets; the proceeds of which will all be coming back to Brakenhale and our fund raising initiative for equipment in our new build. If you have any tickets you are unable to sell please send them back in so we can pass them on to those who are able to.

This week I have had the privilege to go in and teach some design lessons and see young people incredibly focused and engaged in designing their own chairs. Their enthusiasm, humour, engagement and innovative outlook was a real example of the learners at Brakenhale.

FAB feedback this week:

- Just a note to say that the eedi.com feedback has been so valuable for us to see where our daughter is struggling with her Maths, but also how revelatory it is to see her overall effort quantified at the end of each report; it really puts into perspective that our focus as parents should be upon her effort, not upon her grades. Once the effort is being acknowledged and supported at home as well as at school, then her results will necessarily improve. I appreciate and admire the staff at Brakenhale, they all seem so keen in helping the children engage with the material, while at the same time being mindful and proactive about their pastoral needs. We feel very lucky to be a part of this community.
- Raising over £300 for Children in Need, great job.
- Seeing the new school build slowly going up as passing and in newsletters. Just hope the new Brakenhale keeps all its characteristics along with wonderful leaders and staff.
I have been involved from the very beginning with the design of the new building and I promise you all current characteristics will remain.
- Nice to see so much going on in PE - after school clubs, events and newsletters packed with PE info. Well done to Mr Potter and all the PE staff.

DRAB feedback this week:

- Are there any plans to have additional lockers installed? My understanding is that there is a very long waiting list, but unfortunately it means my child has to carry her book bag, PE kit, and winter coat with her all day. Unfortunately this is leading to her forgetting to take everything sometimes and then losing it.

I have managed to source an additional 20 lockers which will be available on a first come first served basis at £25 for the year. I will be sending a school comms out with details on how to apply for one.

- Year 11 need more period 6 sessions - maybe optional - My son feels as if it would really benefit him as it makes him feel as if the hour he does of revision is good quality.

After Christmas we intend to introduce a new period 6 timetable across the vast majority of subjects to ensure that all students have access to the level of revision they require.

- There should be a GCSE pod (science revision material online) for KS4 as the previous Year 11 had it.

I am currently in negotiation with the company to see what deal we may be able to obtain. Last year, due to an agreement we had with a sister company our membership of GCSE Pod was very inexpensive and the PTA picked up the remaining cost. Unfortunately, this year the PTA do not currently have any spare funds. Watch this space I will be in touch soon.

- The floor in the main hall is filthy. It's been like this for an extremely long time now and during the mocks we end up sitting in piles of sand and dust, as well as our bags getting covered in it. I don't understand why it's not being cleaned because it obviously needs to be and clearly it's not.

I totally agree that cleaning at the moment is not of the standard that I would expect. We are currently in negotiations with our cleaning company.

- As totally agreeable as it is that students shouldn't smoke in or by the school site, it's still quite hypocritical to see two teachers smoking by the gates after school and this can happily be tolerated because they're teachers.

I was horrified to hear this and I have identified the people involved who were not teachers but still employed by the school. They have been given a clear warning by myself and their line manager and I can only apologise.

- Eedi - there has never been any mention throughout all the communications that to really use the functions described to parents we have to pay a monthly subscription! The 'free' subscription has really no use to it all as far as we can see once logged in!

I was unaware that this was the case and on investigation I have discovered that the company themselves have made an error in saying this. I can confirm that there is no charge.

- My daughter today received a 10 minute detention because she decided to eat her lunch inside instead of standing around outside in the freezing rain. She says there is not enough shelter. With the new build - will there be plenty of sheltered outside space?

When it is cold and wet, all year groups have accessed to staffed indoor areas and these are displayed on posters around the school. Please contact me directly so that I can deal with this as no child should be given a detention for eating inside a designated area during wet lunch. There is always space in the dinner hall albeit a little cramped. The new build will have a fantastic indoor dining area which will seat all students.

- Planner never looked at or signed yet we as parents are expected to update.

Please contact me directly and I will speak to the tutor involved and I will investigate this.

- Miss Gooding - For being really understanding and helping me to get through the week when it was quite tough.
- Mrs McCrorie- She is always so lovely when you enter the head of years' office and is always there for comfort and help when you need it.
- Miss Manisier - I came to Miss Manisier with a concern via voicemail and she got back to me within the hour, in spite of her busy schedule. We spoke on the phone and she took detailed notes, listened intently and made sure she had a full grasp of the entire situation. It's wonderful to know the children of Brakenhale are in such safe hands.
- Mr Maye - Because he's always there when you need him plus he's a great teacher.

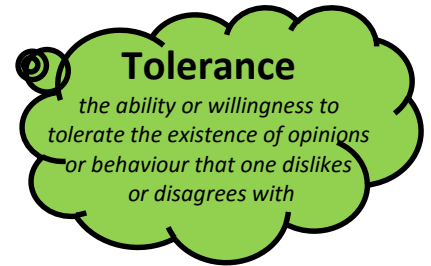

National Online Safety #WakeUpWednesday

7 questions to help you start a conversation with your child about online safety

- Which apps/games are you using at the moment?**
THIS WILL GIVE YOU A GOOD OVERVIEW OF THE TYPES OF THINGS YOUR CHILDREN ARE USING. ASK THEM TO SHOW YOU THEIR INTERESTS. REMEMBER THAT THEY MIGHT NOT TELL YOU EVERYTHING THEY ARE USING, SO IT IS A GOOD IDEA TO ASK THEM TO SHOW YOU. ALSO ASK THEM TO SHOW YOU HOW THEY CAN USE THEM IN A POSITIVE WAY, ALSO ASKING THEM TO SHOW YOU IF POSSIBLE.
- Which websites do you enjoy using and why?**
AS IN THE TIP ABOVE, ASKING THIS QUESTION WILL ALLOW YOU TO FIND OUT WHAT YOUR CHILD IS DOING ONLINE AND ENCOURAGE POSITIVE CONVERSATIONS ABOUT THEIR ONLINE ACTIVITY. ASK THEM HOW THEY USE THE WEBSITES, AND TAKE AN INTEREST IN HOW THEY CAN USE THEM IN A POSITIVE WAY, ALSO ASKING THEM TO SHOW YOU IF POSSIBLE.
- How does this game/app work? Can I play?**
SHOW A GENUINE INTEREST IN WHAT THEY ARE DOING. WHILE YOU ARE PLAYING A GAME OR USING AN APP WITH THEM, IT MIGHT BE EASIER FOR THEM TO TALK TO YOU. REMEMBER TO TAKE A DANGER TO THEM, IF THEY ACT LIKE THEY DON'T WANT TO SHARE THEIR ACTIVITIES WITH YOU, DON'T PUSH.
- Do you have any online friends?**
CHILDREN CAN FORM POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEOPLE ONLINE, AND THIS HAS BECOME MORE COMMON THAN TO ONLINE MULTI-PLAYER GAMES, BUT THEY MAY NOT FULLY UNDERSTAND THE RISKS OF ONLINE FRIENDS AND STRANGERS. YOU COULD ASK THEM THIS QUESTION MORE SPECIFIC TO YOUR CHILD, FOR EXAMPLE, 'HAVE YOU MET ANYONE ONLINE THAT YOU LIKE TO PLAY GAMES WITH?' OR 'DO YOU WANT TO SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOU, SO ENSURE YOU TEACH THEM ABOUT HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS.'
- Do you know where to go for help?**
ALTHOUGH YOU MAY BE THE ADULT THEY TRUST THE MOST, SOME CHILDREN STRUGGLE TO TALK ABOUT WHAT HAPPENS ONLINE DUE TO CONFUSION OR EMBARRASSMENT. BECAUSE OF THIS THEY ARE SOMETIMES FORGOTTEN. HAVE A CONVERSATION WITH YOUR CHILD ABOUT WHERE THEY CAN GO FOR HELP AND HOW THEY CAN REPORT ANY ACTIVITY THAT THEY BELIEVE IS INAPPROPRIATE ONLINE.
- Do you know what your personal information is?**
YOUR CHILD MAY ALREADY KNOW WHAT THEIR PERSONAL INFORMATION IS BUT THEY MIGHT NOT THINK ABOUT HOW IT CAN BE SHARED. HAVE A CONVERSATION ABOUT WHAT PERSONAL INFORMATION IS AND HOW THIS CAN AFFECT THEM IF IT IS SHARED BEYOND THE NUMBER OF FRIENDS OR CONTACTS. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOUR CHILD UNDERSTANDS THE DANGER OF SHARING THEIR PERSONAL INFORMATION ONLINE, AS INFORMATION SUCH AS THIS CAN SPREAD QUICKLY ONLINE.
- Do you know your limits?**
CHILDREN MAY NOT UNDERSTAND THE NEGATIVE IMPACTS OF BEMISE OR GAME ADDICTION. TALK TO THEM ABOUT HOW ADDICTIVE GAMES AND APPS CAN BE, AND HOW THIS CAN AFFECT THEM. ONLINE OR PLAYING A GAME IS AFFECTING THEIR SLEEP, PERFORMANCE AT SCHOOL, OR IF THEY ARE SOMETIMES FORGOTTEN BY OTHER ACTIVITIES. YOU MAY WANT TO ENCOURAGE ALTERNATIVE ACTIVITIES AND DISCUSSING THE INTRODUCTION OF TIME LIMITS WHEN AT HOME.

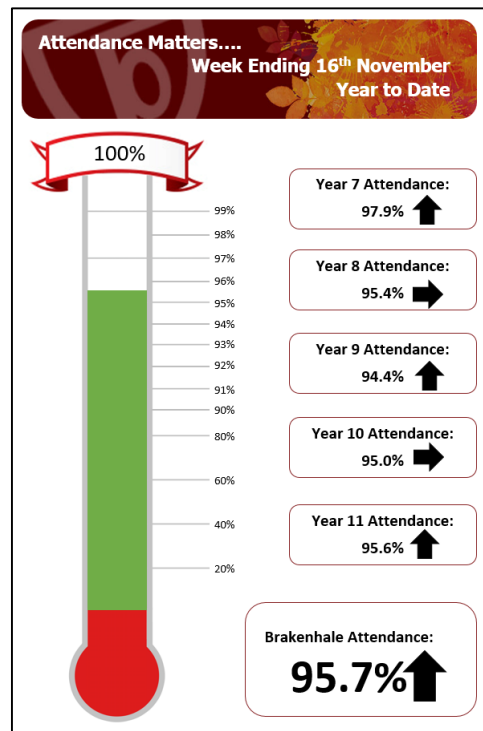
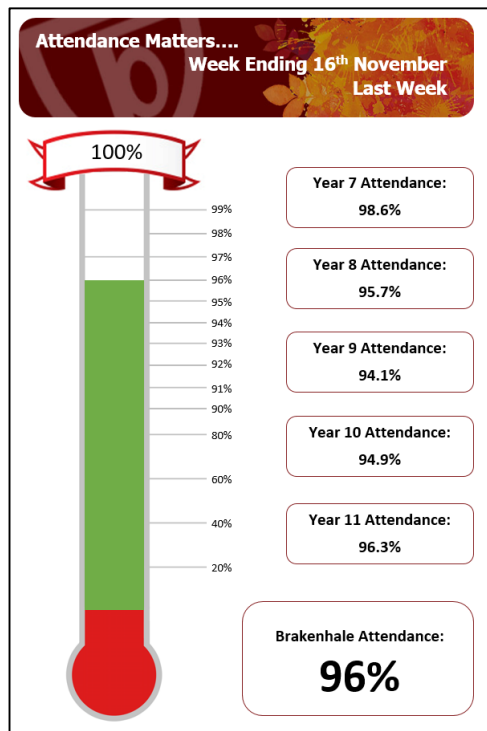
