



Dear Parents/Carers

This week we have completed our final tours of the school for prospective parents having now shown around over 700 people. I have thoroughly enjoyed leading these and meeting so many enthusiastic and positive prospective parents and students. We look forward to receiving their applications!

Last night we held our annual 'Meet the Tutor' evening for our Year 7 parents and students. They were able to chat through with the tutors the experience that their child has had during the first half term with us. This information, along with the feedback form, helps us to build upon a successful experience for our new starters. The first few weeks of starting secondary school can be very daunting and it is important for the rest of their school life that we get this right for them. If you have any feedback please add to the fab and drab or alternatively contact the team by email; the responses we have already received have been incredibly positive and helpful.

On Thursday, a number of our Year 10 and Post 16 students attended 'The Diana Award Anti Bullying Ambassador training day' where up to 150 students from various schools came together to be trained as Anti-Bullying Ambassadors. Mrs Palmer and Miss Gooding accompanied the students and there is a report further on in Parent News. I have no doubt that this is a fantastic initiative that will go on to benefit many of our students. It really is a further example of #TeamBrakenhale, as our students work together to support each other.

Another example of our community working to support themselves and others was our cake sale in aid of 'Mental Health Awareness' day. The 'Esteem Group' led by Mr Read-Linton raised over £100 for this great cause.

Today, both Year 11 and Year 12 have been on trips out of school to support their careers education. Year 11 have visited the bespoke Careers Fayre in Bracknell with their tutors and key Year 11 staff, whilst Year 12 have been to Olympia in London for the Careers Live Fayre. We are fully committed at Brakenhale to giving all of our students as many opportunities and as much advice and guidance for their future as we possibly can.

Some of you may be aware that by April 2019 we will have had our first Ofsted visit since becoming Brakenhale Academy. We will only receive 18 hours notice of this visit, so we are making sure that we put plans in place to make the organisation as smooth as possible. Our internal feedback system continues to work very effectively. This week's comments are as follows:

**FAB feedback this week:**

- Thank you to all the wonderful teachers who spent their evening yesterday (4/10) taking a large group of Year 10 and 11 students to Wimbledon Theatre. It was such a great opportunity, and I know that this would have been something that was done in their own time. My daughter said she really enjoyed it and felt that this has improved her understanding of the play, this will, I am sure really help when she comes to do her GCSEs next year.
- My son had the opportunity to be a student runner for the first time this week and thoroughly enjoyed it. Thank you for giving students this opportunity, it's such a good idea and gives them the chance to see many other aspects of school life.
- I like how I can email the teachers about things that may be concerning me about my child and they respond very quickly. They are always supportive and do what they can to help. I feel there is good feedback from the teachers.
- The school care goes beyond the 3pm bell. Our child feels safer walking home seeing many staff members walk the streets some of the journey with them. Thank you.
- Thankful my child's named lost property was found, returned quickly and delivered to my child in class.
- This Fab and Drab system is a great thing and shows how much the school do care and listen to us as parents. Enables us to have our say either way, get a response and drabs seem to get acted upon.

**DRAB feedback this week:**

- The future diary dates on this newsletter (5.10.18) has Liddington revision weekend listed as Oct 19<sup>th</sup> 2018. I thought it was November 2nd?? I went to check the school calendar and there is nothing listed on there. Even the Sixth form open day is not listed on the calendar. It would be nice if events were put on the school calendar.
- *My apologies, I will ensure that these dates are added and speak to staff involved to improve our information on upcoming events. The Sixth Form open evening is 8th November.*
- I am very upset that my son (Year 7) is constantly getting trodden on and pushed around by Sixth Form with regards to lunches, especially when he is then told that "it is a thing" that the sixth form are allowed to push in line for lunch. I don't think this is helpful for anyone or teaches anyone at the school anything. It undermines the whole idea of respect for everyone and it condones Year 7s to be effectively picked on by their elders.
- *I am incredibly sorry that this is how your son feels. I will speak to the Sixth Form with regard to this and alert all staff in the dining hall. Please can you ask your son to notify a senior member of staff who will always be in the dining hall if this happens again.*
- Why does PE before lunch not finish on time? My son had barely any time to eat again today due to it being 10 minutes into lunch break before being sent in to change from his PE lesson! It's very "DRAB" when staff have no time keeping skills!
- *I fully agree that children should be released on time and I will talk to the Head of PE to ensure that this happens moving forward.*
- When Year 8 have PSHE the Y half misses fun lessons for example PE and Dance and the X half miss English or Maths - this seems unfair.
- *PSHE is run on a carousel system and the time and day changes for every session. Therefore, the same lesson will not be hit more than twice and some only once in an entire academic year.*
- Is there any way of being offered the option of paying into a "cooking kitty" for some or all ingredients. We very often have to purchase items that we only need a small weight of, then the remainder has to be given away as it cannot/will not be used for one reason or another. It is not very cost effective for parents. I know of low income families where their ingredients are purchased for them, could the other students have the option of paying into that scheme.
- *This is a really constructive idea and I will speak to Mrs Higham the Head of Design Technology and see if we can find a way forward with this.*
- Very few places for my child to sit down and eat packed lunch.
- *I totally understand that the site is very busy at lunch time. There are always seats in the dining hall although it is sometimes cramped. Please can you ask your child to let their tutor know of this problem and I promise we will find them somewhere to go.*

Jake Carter and Jack Leigh in Year 9 - a police officer had attended a report of a 5 year old boy who had run off from a local primary school and had been reported missing. His father, other parents from the school and numerous police officers flooded the area of Birch Hill and South Hill Park looking for him. As the police officer ran through South Hill Park, she had many adults tell her that they had seen a very young boy in school uniform walking by himself - yet not one person had thought to stop him! They continued to look and eventually located the boy in the woods very upset and worried. He had been stopped by these two students who had

seen the boy by himself and used their initiative and stopped him, took his hand and once they had seen the police walked him over to them. You are both amazing ambassadors for the school - well done!

Laura Heaffey in Year 12 - who has been selected to represent Great Britain in the Team Gym European Championships in Portugal. We are very proud of her. Well done Laura!

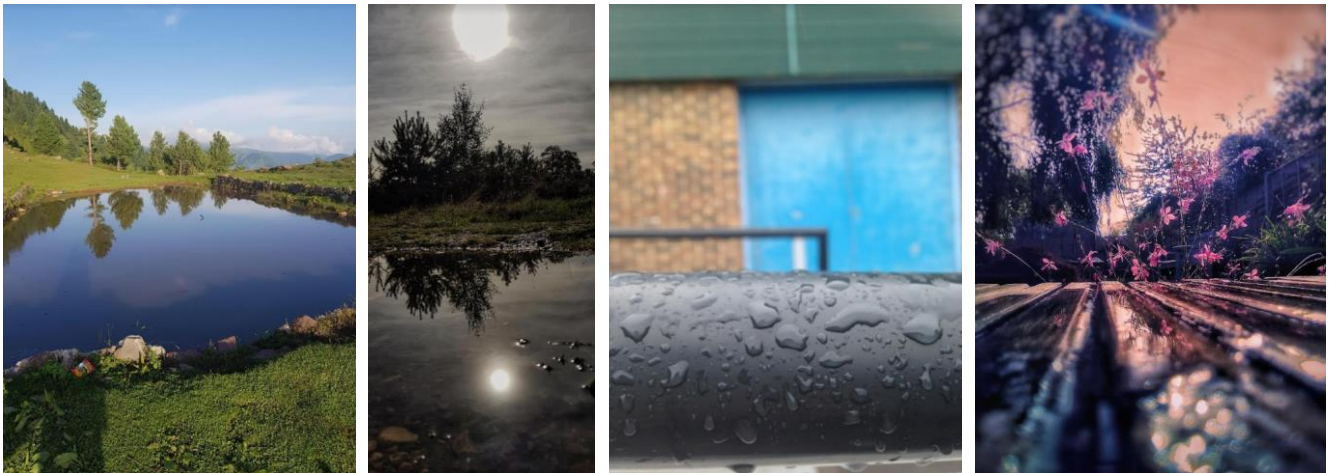


## Camera Club

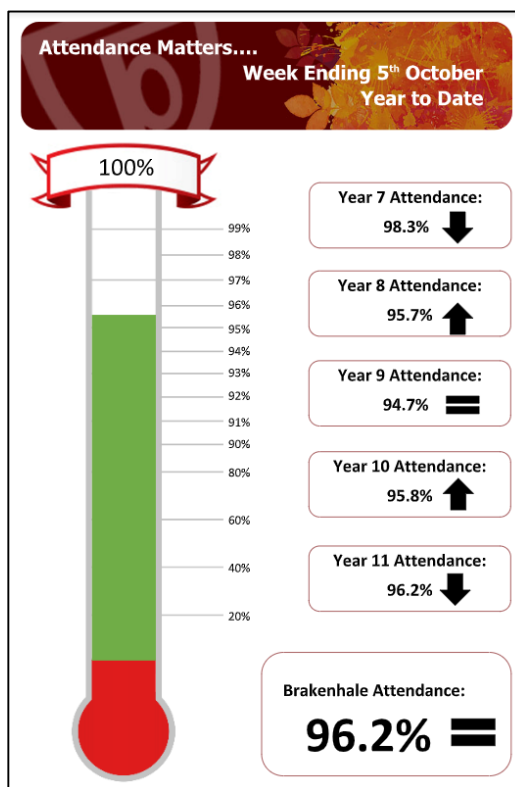
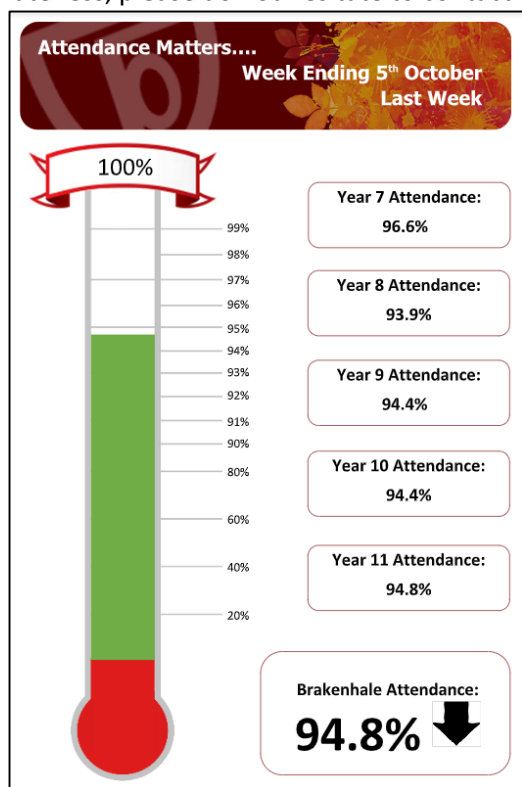

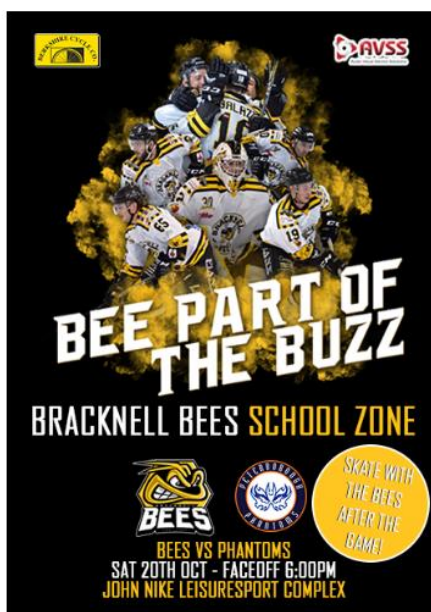
