Dear Parents/Carers and Students

I hope this finds you well. We had made it through a successful first half term of this academic year!

For my piece, I want to focus on 'democracy' as this has been a running thread throughout this week and, given what has been going on nationally with by-elections yesterday in England and international events that have dominated our news stories, such things may be at the forefront of our minds.

Throughout the week, assemblies have focused on two elements: Student Representatives pitching for their selection on the School Council followed by the Head of Year teams sharing and showcasing some end of half term awards. I have attended each one and not only have there been some insightful speeches but students' respect and response to their peers has been endearing. I thanked each year group on their start to the academic year and long may it continue.

Student Council is formed of Representatives from every year group: 7 right through to 13. Members are elected by their peers. The Council meets to discuss the views from peers in their year groups. I shared some precise examples of how student voice and democracy in action can have a positive impact on our school.

- a. Last year, the Council discussed toilet access and availability of sanitary products. As a result, over the summer we changed the ground floor toilets only to make one for the male gender and another for the female gender. The female toilets are now closer to the medical room where they can access products as they wish. Furthermore, every office throughout the school is regularly stocked up with sanitary products so that students can gain access to these from multiple members of staff. We have also provided products to students and families over the holiday period should they require it. This change was a direct result of School Council's discussion.
- b. The Council also discussed rewards and opportunities for this academic year. As a result, we introduced Culture Cards as a mechanism to capture students' positive attitude to different aspects of the school. A separate comms on this is being shared to outline the 'what' and the 'why'. Furthermore, as I write this, 'Brakenchill' is about to start! This is a reward event for every year group with a simple criteria for entry: at least one House Point throughout the half term and not one suspension. Every student will have an ice cream and a lesson to play games, listen to music etc. throughout the morning. This is a change to anything we have done before. We have another rewards opportunity in the last week of the next half term, in December, which will include a trip to bowling! More of this will be shared on the first day back after half term. Such rewards are an addition to House Points and Golden Tickets from last year. Again, this change was a direct result of the School Council discussions last year.

c. Some of our younger students had brought to the discussion 'corridor movement' and so we refined this. Whilst we narrate 'walking on the left', over the summer, lines were drawn throughout the corridors to help visualise this for all. All teachers, during transitions, remind students of this. This has helped the flow and continues to enable the calm and orderly movements throughout the school. Again, this change has been a direct result of last year's School Council discussion.

There are more examples of the above. However, what this shows is that students putting themselves forward in democratic processes can enable change. As I shared with all year groups, such requests as "can we finish school at 1pm everyday" will not happen! However, some of what is discussed and shared will be enacted.

As I communicated two weeks ago, the half termly newsletter is now refined. Last year, this came to all of you and was 40+ pages. It had too much in it. As of this year, it will be simpler and shorter. Here is our first one. It includes the highlights from the half term. We will continue to share updates on our Facebook page. I know not all of you are on it but it's another avenue whereby we can communicate what is happening in the school. Year team updates will be sent to respective year groups families only.

We look forward to seeing all of our students back on Monday 30th October. Year 11 and Year 13 students begin the first round of Pre-Public Exams (PPEs). Their dedication and hard work will pay off; they must devote time during the half term to ensure success in these. In terms of results, national data on the GCSE outcomes from this summer was released yesterday. As a school, our progress score is the highest it has been since this measure has been in place. Not only is it higher than last year when there were some adjustments to exams and students' prior knowledge of topics, the progress score is higher than in 2019 which is pre-Covid times. Well done to everyone who has played a part in that journey. This year's Year 11 will surpass this too!
