## The Current Higher Education Climate

- From 2025, the numbers of 18-year-olds will increase again
- Competition for places at top universities remains as hard as ever

#### 2024 UCAS application data


- 594,940 applicants in total
  - 316,850 applications were from 18 year olds who have just completed their P16 education - increase of 0.7% since 2023 and the second highest number on record.
- International applicants totalled 115,730.
- The number of disadvantaged 18 year olds has increased by 30% over the last 10 years and 2% since 2023.

## Apprenticeships

- Paid job with training
- Apprenticeships are available at levels 2 to 7
  - That's GCSE level right up to Masters
- An apprentice must spend 20% of their time in 'off the job' training which will be delivered by a training provider such as a university
- Very competitive and increasingly so -278,590 started apprenticeships in 2023, 275,630 in 2022. 25% of all apprenticeships were from under 19s.






## NATIONAL AVERAGE APPRENTICESHIPS SALARY



- It also provides online application portals, several search tools, and free information
















- Every university course will stipulate the minimum grade requirements or number of UCAS tariff points that should be achieved by a student for entry onto the course
- Students' UCAS application will stipulate teachers' predicted grades and universities will consider applications based on these predictions

### **Predicted Grades?**

- The grade of qualification an applicant's teacher believes they're likely to achieve under positive circumstances.
  - In other words, what a student will achieve on their best day
- These predicted grades are then used by universities and colleges, as part of the admissions process, to help them understand an applicant's potential.







# **Applications**

- Students have 5 choices for the Universities/courses they will apply for
  - No preferences expressed choices are listed alphabetically
  - Invisibility of choice Universities can't see where else you have applied
- Teachers predict grades and compile subject references for students
- Students enter in all personal information on their UCAS portal
- Students compile a personal statement
- The entire application is reviewed by tutors, and HOY.

Payment of £27.50 needs to be made by credit or debit card

# **Applications**

- The personal statement is an opportunity for students to sell themselves
  - What skills make them better than the next person who has the same excellent qualifications?
- 75% academic
- 25% non-academic
- Around 550–1000 words (1 A4 sheet of paper)
- Character limit of 4000







## Deadlines

- 16 October 2024 (18:00 UK time) Universities of Oxford and Cambridge as well as medicine, veterinary and dentistry courses.
- 31 January 2024 (18:00 UK Time) All other universities and courses.
- 'First come, first served' at some universities
- Universities can make an offer or reject ongoing until May
- Offers will be conditional or unconditional conditional offers will require certain grades to be met.
- Can apply for deferred entry if you intend to have Gap year







## Parent Involvement

- Ask questions and have conversations
- Encourage discourse with teachers
- Offer to read personal statement
- Research & attend University Open days these are happening now.







## Parental Involvement

- Open Days
  - When a university invites prospective students onto their campus to look around, experience their teaching methods and ask all the course-related questions you have
  - Opportunity to see halls of residence, sporting facilities, social areas.

















## **Next Steps**

- Students will 'submit' their personal statements to us by 25 October 2024
- The application will be held by the school so we can collate everything, and quality check your application
- The application is then sent through UCAS after we have a final check, confirm all the details, and upload our references
