## Maths

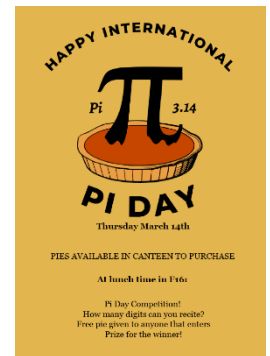

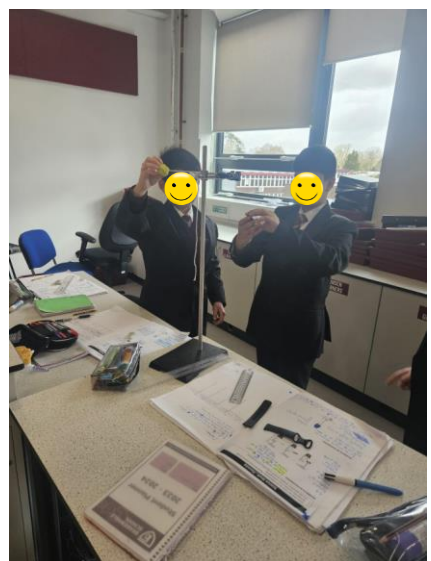
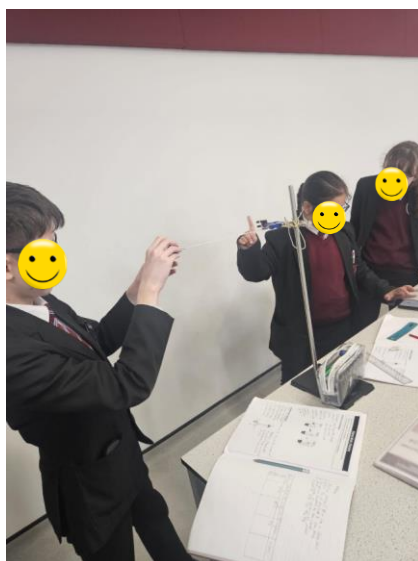
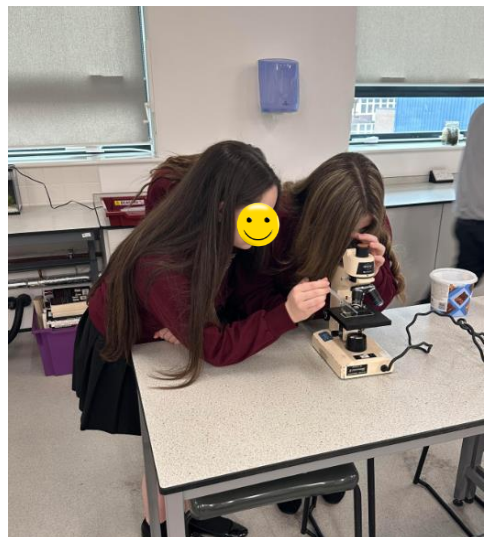
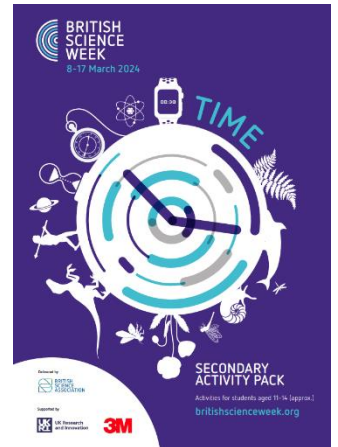
### British Science STEM Week

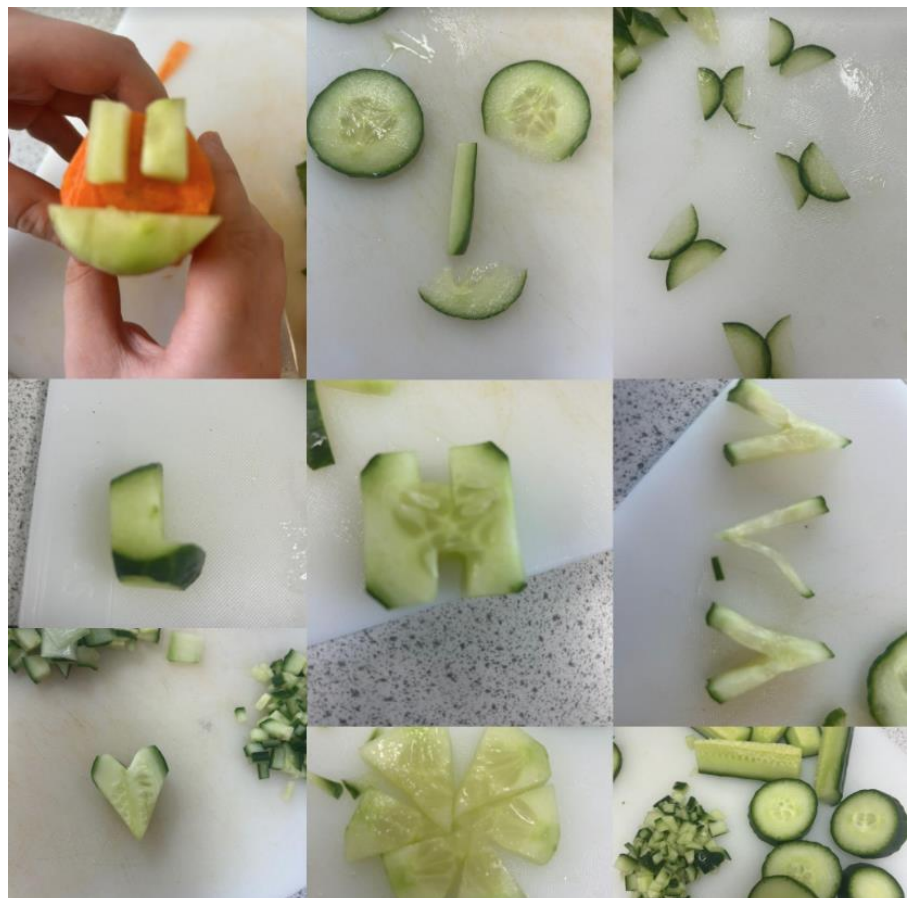

It's been a wonderful term to see students from all year groups be so receptive and engaging to our careers related activities. Each student is so individual and has so much potential of their own, making them aware of their unique strengths and interests helps for a great career ahead. Our aim is to connect them to their most suited and matched career, whilst using our values to help them on their journey - Be Kind – Take Responsibility - Aim High.

I always encourage students and their carers/families to look at the opportunities on the Padlet I have created; mostly free opportunities that could really give our students a more holistic approach to careers. Please also remember our Brakenhale Careers website has plenty of information, quizzes and tools to use. Getting as much careers exposure really does put our students in a strong position for the future.

This is what each year group has been up to this Term:

**Year 7** had a tutor time focused activity around Challenges and rewards of work. They had a careers assembly with more guests planned for next term.

**Year 8** had a day dedicated to careers, which involved DHL, the Global Logistics Giant, talking through what it is like to work for their business and the types of roles they hire - all high level inspirational information. Screenwriter, Tom Keenan and Music Composer, Kelly Buckley also talked to students about their very own careers. Students spent time with their teachers going through a Careers Booklet and a teacher-led lesson on 'transferable skills' was provided. The focus was to get them thinking aspirationally about what jobs would suit their transferable skills.



**Year 9** had an extended assembly focusing on careers with guest speakers from Brakenhale Sixth Form, Bracknell & Wokingham College and DHL representing Apprenticeships.

**Year 10** had a full careers day which focused on writing their curriculum vitae (CV) and interview training. The afternoon was spent completing thought provoking Post-16 related questions and attending an interview with an external guest from (ideally) a career or industry that they are interested in working in. We also had Kris Hatton from Complete Academy give a talk on 'unleashing your potential.'



On Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> February some of our Year 10 Business Studies students went to Porky Whites (sausage making factory) and learnt more about how a business runs and what careers help it to be successful. Students had a speed networking event with the following departments; social media, marketing, accounts, production and sales. We had a tour of the factory and can confirm the sausages are so tasty!

All **Year 11** students should have completed their first, second and third choice Post-16 option. If you haven't then please ensure this is done over the Easter holiday. I always encourage every single Year 11 student to have the following options:

- Option for their predicted grades
- Option for their better than expected grades
- Option for them getting less than expected grades or not even sitting the exams due to chickenpox! Even for grade 9 students, life can get the better of us sometimes, and we all must have a plan A, B and C.

For **Year 12 and 13** it's a busy time with post-18 applications and planning. At Brakenhale School we firmly believe that all students benefit from outstanding school attendance. We are extremely proud of our student's attendance each and every day and we want to continue to maintain these high standards.

We expect that all students will:

- Attend school every day that the school is open;
- Attend school punctually;
- Attend school appropriately prepared for the day.

## The legal framework

**Regular school attendance of children of compulsory school age is the responsibility of the parent/carer and is a legal requirement in accordance with section 444 (1) of the Education Act 1996. Parents/Carers are committing an offence if they fail to comply with this legislation and legal action can be instigated.**

**There are 190 school days in the year and we expect students to attend school every day that the school is open.**

We know that illness is unavoidable and to be expected but knowing whether students are going to be absent from school and the reasons for any absences is an important part of safeguarding.

**Parents/carers who have day to day responsibility for the children and young people must the following:**

- Encourage regular school attendance and be aware of their legal responsibilities.
- Ensure that the child/children in their care arrive at school punctually, prepared for the school day.
- **Years 7 to 11:** Contact the school office before 9.00am on the morning of each day of the student's absence by our preferred option to report your child absent or notify us of an appointment - **My Child at School app- MCAS**. Please note that any 'unexplained absences' will be treated as unauthorised absence.
- Provide medical evidence where the illness/absence is frequent or long term. **\*If the illness is longer than four days we will require medical evidence to be able to authorise the absence.**
- Make all non-emergency medical appointments during the school holidays (see term dates above) or out of school hours. Medical evidence of these appointments during the school day should be provided ie. medical appointment card and the school will need to be notified no later than 24 hours in advance. It is expected that students attend either side of medical appointments.
- Punctuality is highly important. The school gates close at 8:35am. If students arrive after 8:35am, they will be required to go through the School Office and marked with a L – late mark and receive a sanction. Please note that the registers close at 9:30am. Students who arrive after this time will be marked with a U – unauthorised attendance mark.

We understand that there may be rare occasions when you are unavoidably late due to unforeseen circumstances. On these occasions please make sure that you contact the school office to inform us when the child will arrive.

At Brakenhale we are committed to supporting students to achieve and maintain good attendance and punctuality. We celebrate students with 100% attendance at the end of every half term/term.

## Special Leave Request

All holidays and days out taken during term time will be marked as unauthorised absence and will be recorded on your child's attendance record. The school will authorise absence in exceptional circumstances only and evidence will be required. Please complete our [online form](#) to request any exceptional absence in advance. Each circumstance is considered and you will be notified of the outcome via email. Unauthorised absence will incur a penalty notice issued by the Local Authority.
